

<u>Subject MFL</u>  <u>Subject Lead:</u> Bianca Puxty	Subject Intent: At St Columba Major, our Modern Foreign languages curriculum is designed to develop pupils’ curiosity and fascination about languages that will remain with them throughout their lives. We aim for our learners to be able to listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding. To explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words. To be able to engage in conversations; ask and answer questions; express opinions and respond to those of others. To be able to speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures. To begin to develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others understand when they are reading aloud or using familiar words and phrases To feel confident enough to present ideas and information orally to a range of audiences To be able to read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing. To be able to describe people, places, things and actions orally and in writing We will strive hard to meet the needs of those pupils with special educational needs, those with disabilities, those with special gifts and talent, and those learning English as an additional language (EAL), and we take all reasonable steps to achieve this.			Catch-Up Plans We are entering into our third year of using language angels and following a whole school progressive plan. Each unit has different levels of challenge and so the learning can be tailored to the need of the class. We now have mixed age classes and so the units have been changed. This will need to be closely monitored to make sure it is pitched correctly.
Teaching In ks2 teachers or TA are teaching French based on a progressive scheme of work created by subject lead taking units from the Language Angels scheme.
