How are rivers used?

What is the horizon line?

The horizon line in a landscape is the place where the sky meets the land. An artist usually puts this in first when composing a picture.

shade: a colour that is a variation on a colour

texture: the feel, appearance, or consistency of a surface or substance

Science - States of Matter

What conditions are needed for different materials to change state?

What is a state of matter?

Matter is any substance that has mass and takes up space (volume).

What are the 3 states of matter?

Solid: having a firm shape or form that can be measured.

Liquid: in a form that flows easily

Gas: a form of matter that is neither liquid nor solid

VOCABULARY

Evaporate: to turn from liquid into gas

Condense: change from a gas to a liquid or solid through cooling.

Precipitate: water released from the clouds which falls to the ground as rain,

snow or sleet.
