Facts	<p>What does an atheist believe? Someone who does not believe in the existence of God.</p> <p>What does an agnostic believe? Someone who believes that nothing can be known about the existence of God.</p> <p>What does a theist believe? Someone who believes in the existence of a God or Gods.</p>
Vocab	<p>Eternal- Existing forever, without end.</p> <p>Creation- The concept of everything being created by God.</p> <p>Evolution- The change of species over time by selection.</p>

Facts	<p>Why do some people need medicine? Some people have illnesses that need to be treated. Doctors give them medicine to help them heal or to manage pain.</p> <p>What are the dangers of taking illegal drugs? People who take illegal drugs may not be able to control their actions or reactions. It may affect their long-term health and could cause serious reactions.</p>
Vocab	<p>Medicine- prescribed by a doctor to help someone get well.</p> <p>Vaccination- An injection that boosts someone's immunity.</p> <p>Vaping- an electronic device for smoking.</p>

<i>How do animals, including humans, change over time?</i>	
Facts	<p>What are hormones? Hormones are chemical messengers that work throughout your body in different ways to help you grow and change.</p> <p>When does puberty start? Usually between 8 and 13, it is different for everyone.</p> <p>What happens when we get old? Your hair turns grey, you get wrinkles and you are less able to repair your body.</p>
Vocab	<p>Puberty- How bodies change and develop during adolescence.</p> <p>Relationships- The way in which people are connected and behave towards one another.</p> <p>Hygiene- Keeping clean to be healthy.</p>

<i>How can we see Art in the natural world?</i>	
Facts	<p>What is observational drawing? Observational drawing is a drawing you see in front of you, made as realistic as possible.</p> <p>What makes a good observational drawing? Good drawings show detail, shadow, contour, depth and perspective.</p>
Vocab	<p>Contours-An outline representing the boundary of a shape.</p> <p>Perspective- The art of representing a 3D object on a 2D surface.</p> <p>Realistic- Representing a drawing in a way that is accurate and true to life.</p>
