	<p>Christians and Jews believe in helping others. What is a charity? A charity is a group of people who raise money to help other people in need.</p>	
Vocab	<p>Charity - a group of people that helps those in need.</p>	
	<p>Samaritan - a charitable or helpful person</p>	
	<p>Unique- being the only one of its kind; unlike anything else.</p>

FACTS	<p>What countries are in the United Kingdom (UK)? Scotland, England, Wales and Northern Ireland</p>	
	<p>How can weather be measured? Thermometer- to measure temperature Rain gauge- to measure rain fall Weather vane- to measure wind direction</p>	
	<p>Weather- Weather is a description of what the conditions are like in a particular place outside.</p>	
Vocab	<p>Seasons- The seasons are four different times during the year with different types of weather.</p>	
	<p>Country- a large area of land where people live under the same government</p>

	<p>What are the names of common fish? Goldfish, clownfish, cod, swordfish, and a shark</p>	
Vocab	<p>Structure- the arrangement of parts</p>	
	<p>Marine-found in the sea</p>	
	<p>Fish- a creature that has gills, fins and only lives in water</p>

FACTS	<p>How did people travel from cities to the Seaside in the past? People travelled on steam trains.</p>	
	<p>When did seaside holidays become popular? In the Victorian era (in the late 1900's).</p>	
Vocab	<p>Past- events that have already happened</p>	
	<p>Victorian era- Time in the past when Queen Victoria reigned (1820-1914)</p>	
	<p>Holiday- a period of time to relax and enjoy yourself away from home</p>
