# Earth and Space



The learning you child will be doing in each subject this term is based on a key question.

The subsequent questions and vocabulary are some of the small steps they will take to achieve their answer.

Please discuss these with your child to help support and reinforce the work they are doing in class.

## **Science Earth and Space**

Where is the Earth in Space and what is beyond?

<u>Describe the movement of the Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun in the solar system.</u>

Rotation refers to an object's spinning motion about its own axis. Orbit refers to the object's motion around another object.

### Describe the movement of the Moon relative to the Earth.

**The Moon orbits the Earth once every 27.3 days**. The Moon orbits the Earth in an oval-shaped path called an ellipse. Because of this shape, the Moon is sometimes nearer and sometimes further away from Earth

<u>Geocentric</u>-The belief that the Earth is at the centre of the solar system and everything rotates around it.

**Heliocentric-** The belief that the sun is the centre of the solar system and everything rotates around the sun.

## **Music- Holst The Planets**

How can Music affect our moods and feelings?

### Who was Gustav Holst and what is he famous for?

Gustav Holst was an English composer and was a music teacher for over 20 years. Holst is most famous for his orchestral suite The Planets.

## What is a graphic score and how is it used?

Many composers use graphic scores instead of traditional music notation to record their musical ideas. A graphic score uses images, shapes and pictures instead of notes.

**Musical Terms**- a description of the qualities of the music such as pitch, tone, dynamics, duration, tempo and rhythm.

**Crescendo/diminuendo-** Gradually getting louder/gradually getting softer.
